INDS 101: Intro to Interdisc Studies

This course will introduce students to the methods, history and theories of the discipline of interdisciplinary studies. Students will identify complex real-world problems and begin to build interdisciplinary pathways towards their solutions. Students will also identify disciplinary priorities and practices and articulate the bridges between disciplines and professions as they begin to chart their individual professional paths.

INDS 200: Interdisciplinary Methods

How do interdisciplinary thinkers solve complex, important problems in today's world? What skills and strategies are available to define complex problems and create methods to solve them? In this course, students hone their skills in asking good interdisciplinary research questions about complex, real-world problems and develop a working knowledge of diverse research methods from multiple disciplines and interdisciplinary approaches. Students will also learn to apply methods and present research ethically and effectively.

INDS 499: Interdisciplinary Capstone

Students will also research and produce a planning document to chart their individual career paths.
